

The highest denomination of US currency ever issued is **\$100,000**.

Fractional notes down to **3¢** were issued when people hoarded coins during the Civil War.

Paper currency is signed by the **Secretary of the Treasury**.

The serial number **prefix** indicates the issuing Federal Reserve Bank:

There are **four** US Mints:

Philadelphia (**P**): largest, makes master dies

Denver (**D**): only mints circulation coins

San Francisco (**S**): mints proof coins
